landing on a dirt road southeast of Interstate 10 and Wilmot Road. "I haven't seen so much dust in my life," said Mable, 56, taking a break after the dust had settled beside the nose-damaged Grumman Albatross. Copilot Ray Black, 37, injured his ankle when he jumped from the plane after the crash landing. A Tucson passenger, Randy Robert; 26, of 4967 N. LaCholla Blvd. was uninjured. The plane had been in storage at Davis- Monthan AFB, before it was purchased recently by Bob Bean of Hereford, who planned to recondition it for charter service.
