Shippers group: new name but same services, rates

The Hawaii Air Cargo Shippers Association has become Robert W. Hall Associates Inc. doing business as Hawaii Air Cargo as the result of recent decisions by the Civil Aeronautics Board.

Robert W. Hall, who was president of the shippers association, said there would be no change in rates or service for Mainland-to-Hawaii freight operations because of the change.

The board approved an application for Robert W. Hall Associates doing business as Hawaii Air Cargo to become a freight forwarder. Hall said that difficulty in raising investment capital was the main reason for discontinuing association operations in favor of forwarding operations.

Hall is also president of Air Cargo Hawaii, a cargo airline.

The CAB recently also approved the common control and interlocking relationships by Hall of Air Cargo Hawaii, Transportation Services of the Pacific Inc. and Robert W. Hall Associates doing business as Hawaii Air Cargo.

Hall said that the main reason Air Cargo Hawaii has been operating since last August is a 14-month delay in the board's decision on the interlocking relationship and common control.

Hall said the carrier will resume service soon.

One of Air Cargo Hawaii's twinengined turboprop Skyvans crashed in August while attempting a landing at Keahole Airport near Kona.
